Annual Report – 2024-25

The academic session 2024-25 began with 73 students enrolled in the Department: 35 in the 5th Semester, 13 in the 3rd semester, and 25 new admissions in the Honours course. A Students' orientation was conducted soon after the new students joined the Department. During the program, all the teaching and non-teaching staff were introduced to the new entrants by the Head of the Department. The Vision and Mission of the College, along with rules and regulation, expectations regarding discipline, and an overview of curricular and extra-curricular activities offered by the College. The students were also introduced to the new Four Year Undergraduate Course under National Education Policy.

The Even Semester results were comparatively better than other departments with a 100% pass percentage in the 6th Semester, 83% in the 4th Semester, and 62% in the 2nd Semester among the fresh students. In the odd semesters, the pass percentage was 100% in 5th Semester, 77% in 3rd Semester and 20% in the 1st Semesters.


