Report on Cyber Security Awareness

On 6th May 2025, the Placement and Career Guidance Cell conducted a seminar on Cyber Security Awareness to educate students about the risks and preventive measures related to cybercrime. The event aimed to raise awareness among students about the safe use of digital platforms and how to protect personal information online.

The session featured three resource persons — two police officers (Yankee Sherpa, Meghna Subba) and one cyber crime consultant (Saurabh Biswas). They discussed various forms of cybercrime, including hacking, phishing, online scams, and cyberbullying.

The police officers shared real-life case studies and explained the legal aspects of cybercrime. They also informed us about how and where to report such incidents. Their insights were both informative and practical.

The subject expert gave a detailed explanation of how cybercriminals operate and how even a small mistake can lead to serious consequences. He emphasized the importance of cyber hygiene, like using strong passwords, avoiding suspicious links, and being cautious about what we post on social media.

The seminar was highly engaging and educational. We learned not only the types of cybercrimes but also how to prevent them. The session increased our awareness and responsibility as internet users.
